We are planning more times of blessing for residents as the families have expressed an interest in going to more homes and playing more music. Please pray that this plan would come to pass as there are certainly enough people in the homes who would be blessed and enjoy it.

Last month I asked you to pray about the possibility of a production company creating a documentary about the work that we do in the homes. The process is going slower than I had first hoped. I look forward to doing some more walking with the kids this summer. Thank you for all of your prayers for my health.
