In the same vain though, now that I think of it, I am happy that he has passed because now he is not in the anguish of his illness or this cruel world but rather he is in the hands of the loving savior who gave his life upon the cross for him. This month he has realized the value of the many years of what can often be a long and tedious faith. This month he has entered life – and indeed he has true life. I guess the more I consider it, some change is actually kind of wonderful...

Thank you for helping us to fill shoeboxes in 2011. Your contribution has helped 93 residents fill 30 shoebox gifts. And you donation did not stop there. Once the gifts were packed by our residents they were then air freighted to India where children in destitute communities received them in time for Christmas. Not only were they given these awesome gifts, but amongst all the clothes, hygiene items, candy, and toys, each child received a gospel booklet in their own language telling them the good news of Jesus Christ! (I assume all responsibility for not collecting the budgeted amount for this program, due to inadequate fundraising. I do have new plans for 2012 so I hope we will not run into this problem again.)

However, despite the financial set-back, it was an excellent year as some new folks came out for the shoebox packing parties for the first time, and again the residents were blessed by being able to share their faith in Jesus outside of their four walls in this way.

Thank you so very much for helping this blessing be a reality to an uncountable number of lives. None of us will really know the blessing that it is this side of glory, but I do know that your kindness has touched at least 127 people.
