My great Uncle Ed is mentally handicapped. It has been my extreme privilege to have Uncle Ed in one of the homes that I serve and to see him so enjoy the times of worship.

The other day during the music he was waving his hands like a conductor of a symphony - it was rhythmic and felt. As he swayed and his body twisted in his wheelchair it dawned on me that this was his equivalent of an "Interpretive Dance"... An Interpretive Dance...

Uncle Ed finds joy in Santa Claus, the Easter Bunny, coloring, and watching football on television. He is hard to understand at times but I always know my name "John-Boy" when he hollers it across a room. I love that he interprets things so simply – to him things are honest and genuine and good. To Uncle Ed, Jesus loves him and there is not a need for any more discussion after that.

I am pretty confident that he does not understand anything about the Holy Trinity or the humanness and deity of Jesus. I'm not even sure if he has ever been baptized. But when I saw him doing his interpretive dance, I could not help but recognize a childlike faith that is pure and simple – a trusting that all is taken care of in the world.

As I celebrated the Easter season, I was reminded that the tomb was empty and because of that Uncle Ed is right – the world has been taken care of.
