## **Ministry Moment:**

This last week I was asked to do a memorial for a person who passed away the week before. I don't know why but this one was different from the many other funerals that I have officiated for people whom I have never met. I struggled with this one and I prayed, "God, how do I offer people proper closure about this man? I do not know where to begin."

When I sat down to begin planning this memorial, God guided me, and I realized that since I do not know how to speak of a man whom I have never met, I must speak to the men whom I have. In speaking about those whom I know, I realized that I inadvertently speak about the man whom I have never met - And so this is what I did.

I spoke how all men were created in the image of God.

I spoke how mankind was created for relationship – First with God and then with each other.

I spoke how when Adam & Eve were banished because of their sin, mankind's relationship with God was severed and how that broken relationship grieved God just as the passing of our friends and loved ones grieves us.

I spoke how God sent his only son to die upon the cross to defeat sin and death in this world and how this is true for the deceased as well as us all.

I spoke how God so loved the world that he sacrificed his one and only son that through faith in him we might live. I spoke to the fact that all mankind struggles with the question about our deceased loved one's eternal souls but how our focus and trust needs to be in Jesus alone for this rather than coming to our own conclusions when we are simply not capable of making judgment of any man's soul.

It feels like this is a lesson that I have to learn, *re-learn*, *and re-re-learn again* every week or so. When I focus completely on Jesus, it is easier to speak to the many people whom He has come to redeem, whom I have never met, and to whom the reality of Christ is most meaningful.
